

Dublin Youth Athletics Basketball Draft Procedures

The following procedures will be used to draft teams:

1. Teams will draw for draft order. The team drawing number one will pick first in the first, third, and odd numbered rounds. Even numbered rounds will be in reverse order of the first round. The team drawing the last pick in the first round will pick last in the odd numbered rounds and first in the even numbered rounds. Once eight rounds have been completed, any remaining players will be randomly assigned. Teams with two or more A-rated players will have 9 players on their teams and will draw first from among undrafted D players. If there are not enough D players, they will then draw from unrated players. Teams with one A-rated player will then draw among all remaining undrafted players. Any remaining players will be drawn by teams which do not have 9 players.
2. Each coach may designate one and only one assistant coach. For purposes of the draft procedures, the following references to "coach" shall include the head coach and the designated assistant coach.
3. All players, including coaches' children are to be evaluated and drafted. However, children of coaches will play for their parent/coach and not be eligible to be drafted by any other team. Any player who does not have an evaluation will be randomly drawn for assignment and cannot be drafted.
4. For purposes of the draft players were rated as follows:
 - A Player is strong in most skills; tends to control or be in control of the game; does most of the ballhandling, shooting, etc.
 - B Player is above average in skills, but does not dominate; good ballhandling and shooting skills; makes contributions to the team.
 - C Player has average abilities; occasionally contributes to the team; can dribble and shoot, but does not control the game in any way.
 - D Player is a novice or has below average skills; has difficulty contributing to the team; tends to be self-conscious of abilities; rarely is involved in the offense.
5. For purposes of the draft, all "plus" and "minus" designations are to be disregarded, e.g. A- is A, B- or B+ is B, etc.
6. Teams may select any player in the draft, subject to the following:
 - a. No child of a coach may be selected by any team other than his/her parent's team.
 - b. Any player rated higher than the coach's son/daughter may be drafted prior to drafting the coaches' own children. Any player rated the same or lower than the coach's child may not be drafted until after the coach's child with the same or higher rating has been drafted. If there are no players rated higher than the coach's child when it is the team's turn to select and the coach's child has not yet been drafted, the team must take the coach's child with that pick.

For example, if the coaches' children are rated "B" and "C", that team may select "A" players in as many rounds as "A" players remain available. The team must select the coach's child rated "B" player if there are no "A" players remaining or the team wishes to now select a "B" player (or below) over the remaining "A"s. That team may select as many "B" players in subsequent rounds so long as "B" players remain, but the coach's child rated "C" must be taken before any other "C" or "D" player can be selected. A coach with an "A" rated son/daughter will have his/her child as the first round draft choice. If both coaches' children are rated "A", they go in the first two rounds.
7. No player made be traded after the draft or his/her random assignment.
